ROOM-AT-THE-INN BABY SHOWER

We are pleased to host a baby shower for *Room-At-The-Inn*. This will be held during our May meeting – **May 23rd at 10:30AM** in the Young-at-Heart Classroom.

Room-At-The-Inn is a non-profit agency responding to the call of Christ to nurture life. They operate housing and programs for homeless, pregrnant and single mothers with children, offering them opportunities to have new lives of healthy, hope -filled independence. Residents are allowed to stay up to two years as long as they are in school and/or working.

Here are some of the items needed by this agency and the mothers:

New/gently used infant-toddler clothers, diapers and pullups (all sizes, especially 4-5), baby wipes, paper products, adult toiletries/shampoo, washing detergents/softeners/dryer sheets, maternity clothes, new/gently used towels, dishes, and Wal-Mart gift cards.

If you would like to participate in this ministry, please bring your donated items to the Arbor between May 15th through May 22nd. Thank you for your support.

For the month of March, 2022, the Church Budget received \$3,542.58 more than it spent. For the year, the Church Budget received \$603.71 more than it spent.

<u>Major Maintenance & Repair Fund</u> – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times. \$61,999.61 MM&RF Money Available March 31, 2022

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principal (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principal can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of March 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$65,953.23 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
