I rejoiced with those who said to me, "Let us go to the house of the LORD." Psalm 122:1

Nestled in a grove of oak trees in the southeastern part of Fentress Township, Guilford County, on Highway 22 in Climax, NC, is located Bethlehem United Methodist Church where Camp Meeting began in 1954 [sic] and has been conducted annually since that time. The main part of the present arbor was built in 1878 to replace the one which had burned. Camp Meeting originally was held in October; later changed to the 4th Sunday in August; still later, because of early school openings, was changed to the 4th Sunday in July. It rightfully remains important to the religious history of the community and the surrounding areas.

At one time, eighteen wooden tents surrounded the hand-hewn log arbor. They provided meager accommodations. Details cannot be covered in this brief account. How would you enjoy sleeping on a mattress of straw covered with a sheet? Would you like to carry your drinking water from a spring some distance away?

These were times when the family came together to worship. They took their religion seriously: prayer meeting before breakfast, at nine o'clock, before the afternoon service and the evening service. Everyone did not attend all the prayer times, but many attended two or more. Several preachers attended and had many services; three different preachers brought the daily messages.

Time gave way to the T Model Ford; the Tenters began to dwindle; many of the tents were torn down, and in 1960 eight block tents were built. Now some people bring their modern campers. The Tenters now enjoy modern conveniences. In 1967 "An Old Time Hymn Sing" was instituted on Saturday evening. This has been a place of worship for 145 years and in 1988 it was declared a Historic Property in Guilford County.

We hope that each of you may reclaim God's presence in your life, that you will reverence this hallowed ground as it has been dedicated to loving service of our Lord and to our fellow man. We trust He will continue to bless His people in the years to come as they continue to worship Him in truth and love.

Budget Results for May 2023

For the month of May, 2023, the Church Budget spent \$39.39 more than it received. For the year, the Church Budget received \$45,497.14 more than it spent.

<u>Major Maintenance & Repair Fund</u> – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times. \$73,606.71 MM&RF Money Available May 31, 2023

Other Designated Gifts – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principal (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principal can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of May 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$54,433.56 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
