Which reminds me of a game we played as children and youth at church called Telephone: where you stand/sit in a line/circle and one person shares a thought with someone and then they share with the person next to them until it makes its way to the last person. As you could guess, or have experienced, the thought first shared is a lot of times different once it reaches the end of the line; sometimes completely different but sometimes with a good solid core of what was first shared. It can be funny and remarkably interesting to say the least.

Which brings me to the next thought upon this train, about A beautiful quote that I have kept near and dear through the years from Saint Augustine (not why this month is called August but possibly should be), "God loves each of us as if there were only one of us." What a powerful, grace-filled, expression of how all of us are so important to God the Father, our Creator. But after checking my resources I found out that over time this is not necessarily the original quote, but this is: "You are good and all-powerful, caring for each one of us as though each is the only one in your care." The original quote is from somewhere between 354AD to 430AD. So, it is not exactly the same and it has been interpreted through the many years, but it is still powerful in reminding us of God's intimate, unfailing love, care, and compassion for His Creation.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT-June 2024

Budget – Revenues & Expenses

\$528,038.26 Total Budget's Fund Balance as of June 1, 2024,

\$533,916.74 Budget's Fund Balance as of June 30, 2024

For the month of June, 2024, the Church Budget received \$5,878.48 more than it spent. For the year, the Church Budget spent \$640.97 more than it spent.

Designated Gifts

Disaffiliation Loan Repayment-The church council voted unanimously on October 22, 2023, to borrow the money needed to pay our disaffiliation expenses from the Designated Gifts Collective Fund Balance. The conference notified us on November 15, 2023, the disaffiliation amount was \$78,485.33.

<u>Major Maintenance & Repair Fund</u> – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times. \$24,181,31 MMA& RE Money Available, hupe 30, 2024

Other Designated Gifts – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

Trust Funds

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of September 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$61,240.48 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.
