From the Pastor's Desk

Philippians 4:6-7

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

This passage. It is quite the passage. With the world we live in and all the things that are going on around us, how can we not be anxious at one level or another-from personal day in and day out struggles and fears to regional, national, and worldly anxiousness and fears? Some might say it is a part of life and every generation must face its own challenges, but at the end of the day, it is not easy; the hurts, fears, and pains are real.

But so is God.

Paul is writing to the Church in Phillipi when things were at odds and the Lord's Church was really starting to grow, and he wanted them to have humility, unity, and the awareness of false teachings. He wanted them to know that there will be sufferings as they imitate Christ Jesus the Lord, but to also have joy with Christ Jesus as Lord. Joy, unlike happiness, cannot be easily taken from us. In the days and times Paul was writing, the world was not much better than today, but there is a call to persevere and how do we do that? Take it to God first. God promises to hear, to be there, and never to forsake. That is more beautiful than the magnificent foliage this time of year. Surrendering it to God first frees us and allows us not to have to carry such a load. It will surpass all understanding, and Christ guards our hearts and minds.

Storm recoveries, the 2024 Election (November 5th), drugs and human trafficking, health issues, financial issues, and spiritual warfare are just some of the things that many are fearing or are at least anxious about. If you have not already let us follow what God's Word instructs us to do and surrender our fears and anxiousness with prayer and petition to God, remember that God wants to hear; He wants us to come to Him who is the Almighty God. He will protect because God still and will always reign; God will see us through for we are of His Creation by His Great Love.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT-September 2024

Budget – Revenues & Expenses

For the month of September, 2024, the Church Budget received \$13,478.38 more than it spent. For the year, the Church Budget received \$30,286.45 more than it spent.

Designated Gifts

Disaffiliation Loan Repayment-The church council voted unanimously on October 22, 2023, to borrow the money needed to pay our disaffiliation expenses from the Designated Gifts Collective Fund Balance. The conference notified us on November 15, 2023, the disaffiliation amount was \$78,485.33.

CONGRATULATIONS CHURCH!! On October 1, 2024 the loan was paid off in full.

<u>Major Maintenance & Repair Fund</u> – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times.

<u>Other Designated Gifts</u> – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

Trust Funds

\$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principle (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principle can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of September 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

\$61,240.48 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.

Disaffiliation Loan

On October 1, the Disaffiliation Loan debt was paid in full with donations from individuals and did not require any Brunswick Stew profit money. On October 22, 2023, the church council agreed to an internal loan of \$78,485.33 as a Disaffiliation Loan debt. In one year we have been able to pay this debt with contributions from individuals, Sunday School classes, groups, and fundraiser meals. We were able to make this inhouse loan because we were in such good financial condition. We proved again we can meet our financial obligations---and now we are still in excellent financial condition and once again debt free! Thanks to so many who contributed so faithfully to this fund.
